

Local Artist Honours Anderson Farm Museum 100th Anniversary of Barn
Donated artwork to be unveiled during 10th Annual Fall Fair

LIVELY, Ontario –Tyler Fauvelle, a professional sculptor based in Lively, Ontario (www.tylerfauvelle.ca) has created a relief sculpture honouring one of the Anderson Farm Museum's most beloved fixtures, the "Barn", which turns 100 years old this year. The relief will be unveiled on the Main Stage during the opening ceremony of the Anderson Farm Museum Heritage Society's 10th Annual Fall Fair at 10am on Saturday, September 10th, in Lively. Donated by Fauvelle, the bonded-bronze relief, which measures approximately a square meter when mounted, will then go on permanent display inside the Barn, for citizens and tourists to enjoy. The sculpture's wood frame was fabricated and donated by the Walden Seniors & Pensioners Woodworkers.

"It's an honour for me to give back to my community, which has been so supportive of my work," said Fauvelle. "Anderson Farm is a picturesque witness to the past, and it's important to celebrate and preserve it."

The Anderson Farm was one of the area's largest dairies in the 1920's and 1930's. Today, the 14-acre property, with its historic buildings, is a heritage museum and site of the AFMHS Annual Fall Fair, one of Sudbury's most popular events.
